ABOUT STEPHEN


STEPHEN LAWRENCE WAS BORN AND GREW UP IN SOUTH EAST LONDON, WHERE HE LIVED WITH HIS PARENTS NEVILLE AND DOREEN, HIS BROTHER STUART AND HIS SISTER GEORGINA.

Like most young people, he juggled an active social life, school work, family commitments, and part-time employment. But he also had ambitions to use his talent for maths, art, and design to become an architect, and wanted to have a positive impact on his community.

Tragically, his dream of becoming an architect was never realised. On 22 April 1993, at the age of just 18, Stephen was murdered in an unprovoked racist attack.

Stephen's death led to profound cultural changes in attitudes to racism, to the law and police practice. It also paved the way for a greater understanding of discrimination of all forms and new equalities legislation.

Stephen's story is both challenging and inspirational. He was a normal young person who made the most of everyday opportunities. Young people today may not yet have heard the name Stephen Lawrence, but as a positive role model for a life well-lived, Stephen's story is as relevant today as it has ever been. Through the Stephen Lawrence Day Foundation, Stephen's legacy will continue to inspire change in classrooms, communities and careers around the world, for generations to come.

Through reflection, learning, and action, we can inspire change and create a better future for the next generation.







FUNDRAISING IDEAS
