Stephen Lawrence's death was a turning point in British history and led to important changes in the way the police deal with hate crimes. His parents, Doreen, and Neville Lawrence, fought for justice for their son and helped to change the laws around racism and discrimination in the UK.

In 2003, Stephen's mum Doreen Lawrence, was appointed to the Order of the British Empire for services to community relations, and in 2013 she was made a Life Peer. She is now known as Baroness Doreen Lawrence of Clarendon OBE, and works in the House of Lords to debate current issues and vote on changes to the law.

Stephen Lawrence Day was established in 2018 to commemorate Stephen's life by creating opportunities for young people. It is a day to remember that everyone should be treated with respect and dignity, no matter what their background or skin color.
