



STEPHEN LAWRENCE DAY: ASSEMBLY PLAN FOR KS4

INTRODUCTION (5 MINUTES)

- Welcome the students and introduce the topic of the assembly: Stephen Lawrence Day
- Explain the significance of the day and its purpose.

THE LIFE AND LEGACY OF STEPHEN LAWRENCE (10 MINUTES)
