

3 ABOUT STEPHEN

Stephen Lawrence was born and grew up in South East London, where he lived with his parents Neville and Doreen, his brother Stuart and his sister Georgina.


Like most young people, he juggled an active social life, school work, family commitments, and part-time employment. But he also had ambitions to use his talent for maths, art, and design to become an architect, and wanted to have a positive impact on his community.

Tragically, his dream of becoming an architect was never realised. On 22 April 1993, at the age of just 18, Stephen was murdered in an unprovoked racist attack.

Stephen's death led to profound cultural changes in attitudes to racism, to the law and police practice. It also paved the way for a greater understanding of discrimination of all forms and new equalities legislation.

Stephen's story is both challenging and inspirational. He was a normal young person who made the most of everyday opportunities. Young people today may not yet have heard the name Stephen Lawrence, but as a positive role model for a life well-lived, Stephen's story is as relevant today as it has ever been. Through the Stephen Lawrence Day Foundation, Stephen's legacy will continue to inspire change in classrooms, communities and careers around the world, for generations to come.







SLRC HOPEFUL FUTURES CREATIVE CHALLENGE



STEPHEN LAWRENCE RESEARCH CENTRE

The SLRC Hopeful Futures Creative Challenge, in partnership with the Stephen Lawrence Day Foundation and De Montfort University School of Art, Design and Architecture, empowers young people to envision inclusive spaces. Through inperson workshops and a national digital challenge, participants explore learning through place, space, and belonging. Activities include envisioning inclusive spaces based on the university's architecture and creating wearable art inspired by themes of hope, friendship, care, and family.



Using the architecture of De Montfort University as a starting point, participants will be empowered to think about how they can shape the built environment that surrounds them and bring to life their visions of what an inclusive space should look like.

Wear Your Art: T-Shirt Printing Workshop - KS2 (10-11 year olds)

Using themes of Hope, Friendship, Care and Family, the young creatives will be inspired by poetry to create their very own art piece that will be captured on a t-shirt to take home and live on as a wearable work of art!
